There is an entry fee of \$40.00 per team, with half the entry fee going back to the winning team. This is a timed event. The team with the fastest time over the weekend will be announced the winner. If there is a tie, the crowd favorite will be the winner. The tasks of this event are listed below. All the competitors rules are listed on the back.


Objective: To start a fire and get your bean can to blow sky high!

<u>The Trapper</u> (1st person): He or she is responsible for the trapline clearing. They must also bring wood back to camp to get the fire burning for supper. The snow is deep, so first- you must strap on a pair of snowshoes. Make sure they are tight and won't come off. You then race to the wood pile for your first piece of wood to return it back to camp. Take as many trips as you need. Or are told to by the Camp Boss.

<u>Chore Boy</u> (2nd person): They are the axe throwing professionals. Responsible to chop the wood and make kindling. Make enough to satisfy the Cook and Camp Boss. You can then help with the fire but listen to the Cook and retrieve the supplies they require. If the Cook sends you out, you will be evaluated on your axe throwing skills so don't forget your axe.

<u>Cook</u> (3rd person): This is where the magic starts to happen. They are responsible for getting the fire going and supper on its way. Get that fire positioned under the bean can and get it cooking. As the fire starts to roar the bean can will bulge up. You are just about to send the Camp Boss running.

<u>Camp Boss</u> (4th person): Very driven or some might say grump. It is their responsibility to make everything run smooth. Yelling encouragement and helpful praise to the other three. The camp boss does not do any of the chores. Instead, they take their place on a stump by the fire. As the fire heats up so should the camp bosses excitement. Supper is just about ready. Get those last orders to the crew to get the job done. When the bean can blows the camp boss springs into action! You'll want to hunt that bean can down and catch it before it hits the ground. If you do, 30 seconds will be deducted from your score. BUT you have competition. When a bean can blows, ALL camp bosses will be in the hunt. If you can knock away competitors bean can, you can stop them from getting the 30 second deduction from their time.

EVENT RULES

The Trapper

- 1. If, and every time your snowshoes fall off you must return to the start without wood, refasten them, and start over.
- 2. You can only retrieve one piece of wood per trip to the wood pile. But you can take as many trips as you like.
- 3. You will have two pieces of wood awarded to you to start. For every extra piece of wood, you take from the wood pile a penalty of 10 seconds will be added to your time.

Chore Boy

- 1. If you cut yourself, you will be awarded a one-minute penalty. Please be careful.
- 2. You can help the cook as required.
- 3. If more matches or paper is required, you will have to complete an axe throwing challenge to receive the items you need. You will be required to hit the inner ring on the target. This will happen every time you need more items to start the fire. (Do Not forget your axe)

Cook

- 1. You will be given two matches and two pieces of newspaper to start. If you require more, you must send the Chore Boy.
- 2. You cannot touch or reposition the bean can tripod.
- 3. When the bean can bulges, you are not allowed to blow on the fire anymore.

Camp Boss


- 1. Entertainment is important. You want to be a crowd favorite in case of a tie. The crowd will decide.
